
AULUS VETTIUS CONVIVA, The Freedman

If you were a Freedman . . .

You did such a good job working for your master that he freed you. This practice was called *manumission*. After you became a freedman, you had the rights of other Roman citizens except you couldn't hold public office.

- Aulus Vettius Conviva was a freedman who archaeologists believe owned one of the most beautiful houses in nearby Pompeii- the House of the Vettii.
- When you were freed, you often became a client of your former master. One of your duties as a client was to support your patron in elections. Election graffiti was found on the outside of the House of the Vettii.

Just because you used to be a slave, that didn't mean you couldn't be wealthy. If you were interested in getting in on the profitable wine trade, you might want to visit the owner of Oplontis B (shown below).
